

## **Dr. Jennifer Dohrn - Bio**

Jennifer Dohrn, CNM, DNP, FAAN, is the Associate Professor and Assistant Dean for Global Health at Columbia University School of Nursing. She serves as the school's Director of the Pan American Health Organization/World Health Organization (PAHO/WHO) Collaborating Center for Advanced Practice Nursing. Jennifer has worked as a nurse educator and nurse midwife for more than two decades. She has worked in Sub-Saharan African countries since 2003, helping to expand the role of nurses and midwives in primary and HIV care. She has also helped to increase the use of simulation learning in nursing curricula.

Since assuming a leadership role in global health at Columbia University School of Nursing, Jennifer has spearheaded the expansion of global clinical practicum experiences—growing the program from four students in 2014 to nearly 80 in 2019. These students complete a 6-week clinical practica at 17 clinical sites in 15 different countries.

Furthermore, in addition to her many contributions to HIV care and prevention, Jennifer is currently leading a study focused on the role of nurses in pandemics. She also serves as a principal investigator for a study on the health needs of Syrian refugee women living in Jordan. Jennifer has had long-standing collaborations with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the Consortium of Universities for Global Health, Global Alliance for Nursing and Midwifery, International Council of Nurses, International Confederation of Midwives, and the WHO.
